Statistics of the Diocese of Syracuse

The Diocese of Syracuse was established November 26, 1886, has 156 active priests in the diocese and 82 retired priests, 70 active permanent deacons and 9 seminarians. Additionally there are 11 priests who have national specialized ministry including military chaplaincy. The diocese is also served by 59 religious men and 332 religious women.

The diocese has 142 parishes, 11 missions and 3 devotional chapels. There are 3 Catholic hospitals in our diocese serving 650,000 people. Eight Special Centers for Social Services assisting 56,616 also exist. The Diocese oversees 16 residential facilities that care for the disabled. There are 5 diocesan Junior / Senior high schools and 23 diocesan elementary schools. The diocese has 264 offices (including schools) and employs 3,000 people.

The current estimated Catholic population is 285,000.

Statistics on the Diocese of Ogdensburg

The Diocese of Ogdensburg, established by Pope Pius IX on February 16, 1872, has 92 active diocesan priests, 50 retired priests, 8 priests belonging to religious institutes, 8 priests working or studying outside of the diocese, 67 permanent deacons, 12 brothers, 4 seminarians, and 157 sisters.

It has 119 parishes, 19 missions and 17 parochial oratories. In addition, the Diocese of Ogdensburg has 21 elementary schools, 2 high schools, 3 nursing homes, 1 alcoholic rehabilitation center and 1 conference center.

The Catholic population is 128,326.
